4. First-aid measures

5. Fire-fighting measures

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

Ventilate closed spaces before entering them. ELIMINATE all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in immediate area). Keep upwind. Keep unauthorized personnel away. Ensure adequate ventilation. See Section 8 of the SDS for Personal Protective Equipment. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing.

Methods and material for containment and cleaning

up:

Absorb spill with vermiculite or other inert material, then place in a container for chemical waste. In case of leakage, eliminate all ignition sources. Dike far ahead of larger spill for later recovery and disposal. Use non-sparking tools.

Environmental Precautions:

Do not contaminate water sources or sewer. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so.

7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling:

Observe good industrial hygiene practices. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Do not expose to intense heat as product may expand and pressurize container.
