Keep unauthorized personnel away. See Section 8 of the SDS for Personal Protective Equipment. Do not handle damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Ventilate closed spaces before entering them.

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up:

Absorb spill with an inert material, then place in a container for safe and proper disposal. Eliminate all ignition sources if safe to do so. Dike far ahead of larger spill for later recovery and disposal. Use only non-sparking tools

Environmental Precautions:

Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so and protect against releases into the environment. Remediate as appropriate. Do not contaminate water sources or sewer.

7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling:
