7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling:

End-users should follow industry best practices for handling and using this product.

Guidance may be found using the current version of ASTM Standard E1497-05: Standard Practice for Selection and Safe Use of Water-Miscible and Straight Oil Metal Removal Fluids Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Add material slowly when mixing with water. Do not add water to the material; instead, add the material to the water. Avoid contact with skin. Observe good industrial hygiene practices. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Do not expose to intense heat as product may

expand and pressurize container.
